

MYSTERY WRITERS TO TELL TECHNIQUE

The techniques of a craft that has made a large public feel apprehensive will be exposed at a panel program tomorrow at 8 P. M. by two veteran "whodunit" writers, Hugh Pentecost and Rex Stout.

The program, at the Donnell Library Center, 20 West Fifty-third Street, is part of the library's "Readers Meet Writers" series. It is a presentation of the Mystery Writers of America, Inc. Admission is by free ticket.

Martin Lowenfish, in the fifth of a series of free art lectures at the Donnell Library, will speak at 6:15 P. M., Tuesday, on "In Asia With an Architect." He is the architect.

Music by Hugo Wolf, Gustav Mahler and Karl Weigl will be heard in a concert at 8 P. M. Wednesday in the Donnell Library. The event was planned in cooperation with the Austrian Consulate General and the Austrian Institute, Inc. Dr. Wilhelm Schlag, Cultural Affairs Officer for the Austrian Consulate, will speak about the three composers and their music.

The concert will include American premières of songs by Wolf and Mahler and chamber music and duets by Weigl. The program was made possible by

a grant from the Trust Funds of the Recording Industries and the cooperation of Local 802, American Federation of Musicians.
